Dear LPIE Families and Friends,





Tom Mulvaney Legacy Award

This spring, the LPIE board of directors announced the creation of the Tom Mulvaney Legacy Award to honor individuals, families or businesses who have demonstrated an exceptional commitment to the LPIE mission. Tom, the award's namesake, has made significant contributions to our school community through his time, actions, talents, and dedication. He is the longest serving member on our LPIE board, going on 16 years.

The award's first recipient is Myrna Kimmelman, Executive Director of LPIE for over 20 years. Myrna grew the foundation from raising \$400,000 per year to raising over \$4M per year. She retired in 2020 but only after leaving a remarkable legacy.

It is with great appreciation and gratitude that we honor both Tom and Myrna for their leadership and generosity.

Thanks to over **6,000** hours of volunteer board leadership, LPIE ran extremely lean, with less than **9%** of expenses going toward fundraising


